Letter from Fr. Tom, ofm

May the Lord give you peace.

Our Christmas celebrations are ended — the church looks bare; if the weather held up the outdoor crèche has been put away; the wreath is gone — but we have been reinvigorated by the celebrations of the memory of God’s presence among us in Jesus, of God’s presence among us in the community — the Body of Christ, and God’s presence that transcends our imaginations. I thank you for all that you have done and are doing to embody the celebrations of God’s love, healing, and compassion.

We shift this week from the Advent-Christmas readings to a text from the Gospel of John at the beginning of Jesus’ public ministry. John recounts the movement of disciples from the Baptist to Jesus, the discovery of titles from Lamb of God to Teacher to Messiah. The disciples of the Baptist are told there is the Lamb of God. He is speaking of what he has come to know, they encounter and name Jesus “Teacher”; ultimately, they discover the one who is the anointed of God, the

Messiah. Perhaps that is our journey as well. When we are beginning our journey, it is someone else who points the way. Our early encounters are as with a teacher, we learn who we are as we learn who he is. Finally, we discover more than a teacher. We discover the one who embodies the love, compassion, graciousness that is God. We repeat the stories as we repeat our own journeys. The revelation is always more and the awe is always greater. We are indeed blessed.

This week there was a move to deport more undocumented refugees from the US. The Salvadorans join the Haitians and the Nicaraguans as people who came for shelter and temporary assistance and have made a home here. It is not that they will return to places that are in any better condition than they left or that life has not changed for them while they were in the US. Some have married and have children; many have jobs and responsibilities; many have homes. The possibility of deportation may separate families, deprive families of income and the loss of a home. The US Bishops have

spoken clearly in support of these refugees, immigrants, brothers and sisters. Our Provincial administration has also joined with the other Provincials of the US in calling for compassion. I ask your prayers for all and for the leaders who are entrusted with the responsibility of supporting the values of our nation. I have been in touch with a friar of our Province who works with the immigrant community and am hoping he or his team will be able to visit us soon to give us a better understanding of what we can do and what is being done. This weekend the Archbishop has a DVD that you can view at Community Sunday on Immigration and Refugees. The disciples of the Baptist ask Jesus, “Where do you stay?” He replies, “Come and see.” I suspect that as we ask that question we will see that he stays with us as well as with these refugees and immigrants.
