Letter from Fr. Tom, ofm

May the Lord give you peace.

Where did the summer go?

I invite you to look at the church windows on the friary side of the church. We will open the side gate this weekend so you can take a walk down into the courtyard to see for yourself. If the stairs are an issue, the elevator from the Center will lead you down to the Friary Meeting Room and the courtyard. The painting has been completed on that portion of the project. This has not only been the much-needed painting but also sealing the windows to protect from rain and ice. Hopefully, those who sit near the windows in the winter will also have less draft coming in from outside. I look forward to the work on the doors. I thank you for your patience in this project and thank everyone who has contributed to the good work of keeping St. Patrick-St. Anthony Church beautiful. Of course, the beauty is even greater in the dynamic praying, serving, gifted community.

As we were working on the windows, we discovered that there was a serious drainage problem. In order to remediate the problem, we needed to take out the overgrown shrubs in the friary and the Anne Uccello courtyards. We will work with new landscaping for these spaces.

The re-carpeting project has nearly been completed. There is finishing work to be done. It has made a remarkable difference in the space. The staff had to live through a few weeks of chaos as offices, meeting rooms and hallways were torn apart and reworked. I thank them for their patience.

2018 marks the 60th anniversary of the merging of St. Patrick and St. Anthony Parishes—the Gaelic and the Garlic! We need to celebrate this amazing combination that continues to thrive in the rich diversity of households who continue to find a home here. I am proposing a year-long celebration. We can begin with prayer and a party—of course! I invite you to mark your calendar for September 30. It is my hope that we can use the new courtyards, Friary Meeting room, and rear parking area. This will keep us off the street and allow the opportunity to enjoy our space. The Ladies Guild marks 80 years in 2018. They began at St. Anthony's and are vital to the life of St. Patrick-St. Anthony.

While the Franciscan Volunteers are not able to join us this year, we are currently working to be sure that Catherine's Place has occupants before the cold weather hits this year. There will be more details to come. We will also make ourselves available as an emergency overflow shelter this winter.

Finally, I thank those who were able to join us for the Eucharist for healing and peace. Our prayers are essential to the process of on-going conversion for us all. The idea of compassionate communities might give some balance and insight as well as an impetus to work for the healing and peace that we so desperately need. If anyone is interested let me know and we can together plan something for the Fall.

Have you ever considered a trip to our Sister Parish?


