LETTER FROM FR. TOM, OFM

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Patrick-St. Anthony
 and St. Genevieve,

May the Lord give you peace.

Alleluia! The Lord is risen! Alleluia!

We gather this weekend at the crossroads. We have completed our Lenten journey and are invited to live more deeply into the transformation as disciples who have discovered deeper intimacy with the Lord through prayer, fasting and works of compassion. It is to be hoped that we do not consider the days of Lent to be an end in themselves and we simply return to former ways of being. We proclaim the resurrection of the Lord and that we are raised with him. How marvelous for us! I thank you for all that you are.

The disciples did not immediately recognize Jesus. In our prayer, works of compassion, and fasting we have had the opportunity of encounter with Jesus. Perhaps, like the early disciples we did not recognize him. In care for the stranger, generosity in the poor box, marching in solidarity with the “March for our Lives”, praying with the scripture, participating in the Eucharist, quiet times of prayer, care for children or the elderly, being present to the sick, laughing with friends, being attentive to the beauty of creation as the promise of Spring reveals itself, and in many other ways we have seen the Lord. I thank you for the ways that you reveal God’s love in Jesus.

We will host many guests this weekend. All are welcome. We each make life’s journey with its many detours and some dead-ends. The church is home, all are welcome. Each life’s journey is

a blessing for all of us. Come to the feast of God’s goodness. Others may have judged us and told us we cannot belong; there is only one who judges-the one who knows our hearts. Let us trust this judgement for this is the same one who calls us to the gathering and to the table. This is the one who has walked with us on all the roads of our story. Let nothing come between us. The message of the resurrection is God’s affirmation: “I want to be with you.” Alleluia!

This weekend our Jewish sisters and brothers celebrate Passover. Let us hold them in prayer and give thanks for their faithfulness to the Covenant. Their Passover gatherings recall God’s liberating activity for those enslaved, those whose humanity was diminished by authorities, the powerless. We are blessed in the many ways that our Jewish sisters and brothers continue the liberating work of God to this very day.



Finally, my thanks to all who participated in the prayer and services of the Sacred Three Days. Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil are powerful expressions of God’s presence with us. Symbols of these liturgies include, shared conversations with the Word, foot washing, Eucharist, the proclamation of the Passion, veneration of the cross, fire, water, Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. We go from the table to the cross to resurrection together. I thank you.
