LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. TOM, OFM

May the Lord give you peace.

This weekend Franciscan women and men throughout the world celebrate the gift of St. Clare of Assisi. Clare was one of the early followers of the Gospel in the way of Francis. She had heard him preach in word and deed. Against all social convention, this noble woman renounced her position and embraced the life of the Gospel. She had witnessed Francis' care of lepers, his presence among the poor and the sick, his brothers who had been drawn to his radical way of life among the outsiders and responded with her heart to the call of the Spirit.

While the friars embraced a life of itinerancy, Clare and the women who joined her lived within the enclosure. This stability of place did not hinder the sisters' mission of feeding the hungry, serving the sick, preaching the Gospel by the witness of their lives, or praying with and for the community. (During my time in Cochabamba there was a riot. The police were throwing tear gas canisters at the rioters. The sisters made a paste of baking soda to help those suffering from the effects of the tear gas. They brought them into a space beside the Monastery and applied the paste.) During her lifetime, monasteries of women devoted to the way of life Clare exemplified began to

be established throughout the world. We are fortunate to have the text of some of Clare's letters to Agnes of Prague. Spending time with these letters reveals a deep, Christ-centered spirituality.

In one of the letters, Clare encourages Agnes and the sisters of her community to a way of prayer before the cross:

*Behold him, that is to say gaze upon him. Keep your eyes fixed on him. Find yourself in the mirror of the cross.*

*Consider him, that is to say reflect on what you see, what you know, realize the wealth of his poverty. Consider the remarkable self-gift freely offered in love.*

*Contemplate him, simply be with him. Be drawn into the depths of that love and rest there in him.*

*Desire to be like him, hear the call to the mission of that same love. Respond to the desire of your heart to live your discipleship with generosity and joy.*

Clare's legacy continues in the lives of the Poor Clare sisters even to this day. I have had the privilege of knowing Poor Clare sisters in Chesterfield, NJ; Wilmington, DE; Cochabamba, Bolivia; Jamaica Plains, MA, Wappinger Falls, NY; Victoria, BC, and the many who

would come to St. Bonaventure University for the summers while I was with our novices. Among the amazing things for me was the joy of the sisters and their knowledge of the scripture. Few of these women had formal training in the scripture, yet their lives of contemplation had opened ways of knowing that are amazing.

The friars are deeply connected to our sisters, the Clares. From the beginning we are invited to the relationship that Francis had with Clare, the mutuality, the prayer, the joy, and the struggles of life. I ask your prayers for the many communities of sisters committed to the Gospel in contemplation. I also ask your prayers for those who might be considering this graced way of life.

On another note, please save the date: October 7, 2018, as we celebrate the 60th anniversary of the union between St. Patrick and St. Anthony parishes and the 80th anniversary of the Ladies Guild! We will host a gathering in the gardens and the area behind the Center. It is sure to be a great time. Please plan to join us.

**A DAY WITH ST. CLARE OF ASSISI**

**Gaze and Consider the Light Within**

St. Clare of Assisi, perhaps best known as the first female follower of St. Francis of Assisi, was a medieval mystic and contemplative. Clare founded the Poor Ladies of San Damiano, a group of religious women, who, after her death, became known as the Poor Clares. She is the first woman to write a rule for a women's religious community and received Papal approval for it on her deathbed.

A feminist before the word was coined, Clare, above all else, recognized and embraced her calling to love and serve God by ministering to, and praying for the poor, marginalized and outcast of Assisi.

The workshop will offer an opportunity for some to spend time with the tavola of St. Clare, which depicts eight scenes from her life. We will reflect on and discuss the challenges, joy and unwavering love she had for God, Francis, the Friars, her Sisters and the people of Assisi as we study this extraordinary icon. Participants will be invited to consider their own lives in light of Clare's devotion. How might we envision our personal tavolas?
