**Communal Anointing at Weekend Masses**  
**November 19-20**

From our Baptism we are called to discipleship. The way of living our gifts changes with the frailty of our bodies, yet we are still called to share our gifts. The anointing is for healing and for a renewal of our commitment to share ourselves in new ways. We embody the gift of God’s Spirit at every stage and situation of our lives. **We invite and encourage anyone** who is seriously ill, with prolonged or chronic illness or disease (*heart, cancer, respiratory ailments, diabetes, etc.*), those with the disease of alcoholism or other addictions, those who suffer from mental illness and disorders, anyone facing exploratory surgery with its uncertainty and anxiety, those experiencing aging with its limitations, its fears and isolation together with caregivers and family members to join us at any of Nov. 19-20 weekend Masses. All are welcome.



**Letter from Fr. Tom, ofm**

May the Lord give you peace.

This weekend we welcome the postulants of our Community for a visit. They will be with us from Friday to Sunday. We also welcome the Franciscan Challenge team who will speak at all of the weekend Masses. I thank you for your hospitality and kindness in response to the Challenge.

In these days since the presidential election, I have been praying for our nation and for our healing. I am reminded of Jeremiah 13. In this prophetic action experience, Jeremiah is told to purchase a linen cloth and to wear it as his loin cloth for a period of time without ever washing it. Then he is told to bury the loin cloth. After a significant period of time he is told to uncover the cloth. It was not a pleasant sight. In the months of the campaign the president-elect has uncovered for us the frayed and soiled garment that has been

covered for too long. He made us look at how it is that we welcome back veterans, prisoners of war, soldiers lost in battle; he showed us how it is that women are treated as sex objects; he reminded us of how the disabled are mocked in mimicry, he noted that racism is still deeply embedded in our culture; he held for us the notion of “just discrimination” against LGBT men and women rooted in the name of God; we saw the fear of those who know God differently - Muslim men, women and children; he enabled us to recognize the dismissal of refugees and immigrants from our homeland.

I state these issues because they enable us to see the frayed, soiled, and fragmented community to which we belong. Our call is to reconciliation, to healing. Our way of being is transformational. Perhaps as long as these things were buried and hidden from sight, we were unaware of the underlying pain, shame, and guilt that has

kept us from talking to one another that has encouraged the fraying of the garment that is our nation. We owe the president-elect a debt of gratitude for opening our eyes to the many injustices that tear the fabric of our nation. The very heart of our Franciscan movement is compassion. Francis found the experience of Christ in the person with leprosy, in the Muslim community, in the bishop of Assisi, and in the community of friars, sisters and people he encountered. We are invited into a time of prayer, transformation and action through which we, like Francis of Assisi, encounter Christ in one another in ever deeper ways. This action is a deepening of our call to be peacemakers and to live justly. As Francis said to the brothers, “let us begin again to seek the Lord.”
