LETTER FROM FR. TOM, OFM

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Patrick-St. Anthony and St. Genevieve,

May the Lord give you peace.

With God’s grace we begin Holy Week. On Ash Wednesday and again on the First Sunday of Lent, I invited us to consider this season as one of greater intimacy with the Lord. Our fasting, prayer and works of compassion were not restitution for our failure, but the affirmation of our communion with Jesus who fasted, prayed, and whose deeds liberated men and women. We come now to the celebration of the passion of Jesus, the passion of God. As we look at it, it is easy to see suffering and to think that the passion of the Lord is his suffering. What if we look at the whole experience of the disciples of Jesus as recounted in the Gospels? We might see that his passion is a passion for humanity, a passion for liberation from every form of bondage, a passion for justice and human integrity. In this sense, Jesus entered into his passion with his baptism and was faithful to the mission for the entirety of his life. His faithfulness, his passion cost him his life because the liberation, the call for justice, and his integrity threatened those in authority. Our call is greater communion with Jesus and with his passionate love for all that God loves, all that God created.

With this in mind, let us take the part of Jesus as we are engaged in the Passion on Palm Sunday. After all, Paul reminds us that we are the Body of Christ. Paul does not say that we are the crowd, the accusers, or those crucified with Jesus. We are the Body of Christ. Our desire throughout this holy season has been our transformation in greater communion with him and his passion. Let us break the bread of life and of the Word together on Holy Thursday before we share in the washing of feet. This is what Jesus did and does. He shared communion at table with the disciples, with sinners, with the broken, the poor, and with the religious leaders of his time. In each sharing he offered liberation and life. Jesus likewise shared the living Word of God in his encounters. He spoke words of reconciliation, of healing and of freedom and of life. He offered healing and life. John’s Gospel recounts Jesus the servant at table who washed the feet of those gathered with him for a final meal.

Let us walk the way of the cross with Jesus on Good Friday. We gather to enter more deeply into the Word, to pray for all of God’s creation, to venerate the cross as the altar where Jesus offered the gift of his very life in fulfillment of his passionate love for God and all of humanity. Then we share in the Bread of Life together—we the Body of Christ receive the Body of Christ as the radical sign of our communion with the one who is love.

We are invited to gather later on Good Friday for Brahms’ German Requiem. This beautiful opus enables our contemplation of what we have celebrated and who we are. Our musicians offer their gifts for us to consider the wonder of God already present among us.

We do all of this in preparation for our Solemn Vigil of the Lord’s resurrection. I invite you into this sacred time of awe, transformation, and communion. All are called, all are welcome—Come!
