

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Patrick-St. Anthony and St. Genevieve,

May the Lord give you peace.

I thank you for your gracious welcome of our brothers Michael and David last week. I also thank you and apologize for the constancy of asking for money. I realize that you are asked to give weekly, to support the Golf Tournament, to contribute to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal as well as the "Forward with Faith" Campaign. I thank you for your generosity and your constant support. I ask that you do what you are able to do within your means. We are a remarkably gifted community in many ways and the sharing of your gifts is more than financial support. That we pray together is our primary way of living our shared gift. How wonderful it is to come together and celebrate our experiences of God's love in this community. From that place of prayer, we each discern how best to give our other gifts as they are called forth. We give from a joyful heart, not because we are burdened with guilt or harassed into giving.

Last weekend, I participated in the Hartford Archdiocesan Synod. This was an incredible gathering of the women and men of the Archdiocese. There were over 300 delegates to the Synod, each coming from various parishes and experiences. The presence of God's Spirit was amazing. There were shared prayers, meals, and conversations. We were invited to be attentive to speakers whose themes included: evangelization, mission, and collaboration. It was wonderful to hear from these speakers living out their call to their baptismal priesthood and inviting us to deepen our journey into the experience of God's love through our life's encounters. This was for me the highlight of the gathering. One speaker noted that her threeyear-old caught her up short one Sunday morning when he did not want to go to church. She was amazed and gently asked why the child did not want to go to church. He whispered that the people were all unhappy, no one smiled or laughed. The life of discipleship and evangelization is about sharing and living "good news". Another speaker challenged us to become more engaged in the mission of the church. He was very keen on experiences of encounter as moments of transformation. would posit that transformation in any encounter with Christ is mutual. We are also changed in the engaged encounter with another or with our own life experiences. He called us to dream of the church we desire and to gather with one another to share our dream of God's presence among us now and for the future. A third speaker called us to collaboration with the larger church in the embrace of three values: humility, forgiveness, and zeal. Our humility lies in our realization of our giftedness seen through the lens of God's love and in our willingness to speak the truth in love. The value of forgiveness is its ability to be transformational. It is to be intentional, continual, and open to asking for forgiveness from others. Our zeal is the divine energy, the Spirit, breathing within us fanning the flames of passion for the Gospel life. In my dream for the church, the living of one's baptismal priesthood in mission is transformative and necessary.

I am grateful to you for being a joy-filled community, a community engaged in mission, and one that seeks to be collaborative while remaining focused on the mission of the Gospel. I thank you.


